Through the senses we connect with our surroundings and each other. FLOOD, the artist group that brought SOUNDWALK to Long Beach for ten years and recently inaugurated *soundpedro* at Angels Gate, is pleased to announce PUMP, a multi-sensory event. After this year's inaugural arts festival, PUMP will occur biennially. For this series of events, FLOOD is pleased to collaborate with <u>Millworks</u> and <u>Arts Council for Long Beach</u>.

As a conduit for creative interactions, PUMP will feature artworks—some interactive and some self-contained—by artists, writers, and performers. These will include sculptures, environments, installations, site-responsive works, projections, interactions, and performances. The event will take place in alternative venues and unexpected spaces across Long Beach. The first gathering will foreground sites and scenes whose ambience exemplify Long Beach's cultural vibe.

PUMP welcomes the interplay and innerplay of our senses and strives to inspire community engagement and exchange of ideas, as well as to celebrate the flavor of Long Beach. From October 7 – 21, discover new things about the city, yourself, and each other through a variety of aesthetic sensory experiences.
